About LifeLong Medical Care

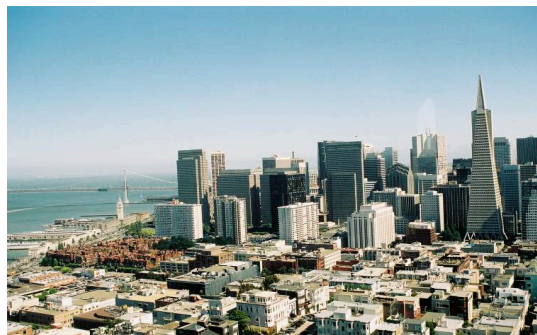

The LifeLong Pharmacy Residency is a one-year, ASHP-accredited PGY1 pharmacy residency. One position is available in the primary care track, and one position is available in the psychiatry track. Ambulatory care rotations occur at LifeLong Medical Care and other partnering clinics in the Bay Area. The inpatient psychiatric rotations take place at St. Helena Hospital, Center for Behavioral Health (CBH) in Vallejo.

The residents will be exposed to a variety of chronic diseases and will be given opportunities to collaborate with other primary care providers within the LifeLong Medical Care system. The residents will also gain a greater understanding of the behavioral, social, economic and cultural issues surrounding direct patient care at a federally qualified health center (FQHC). The residents will take on the role of a pharmacist provider with structured guidance from designated preceptors. In addition, the residents will have opportunities to practice and refine their teaching, research, and practice management skills by precepting and lecturing pharmacy students, conducting clinical research projects, and leading various pharmacy-related educational programs.

Curriculum

The resident will be given opportunities to choose from the following clinical experiences to meet their career goals:

- Primary Care Clinic
 - Diabetes
 - Hypertension
 - Anti-coagulation
- Psychiatry (inpatient and ambulatory care)
- Acute Care
- Ambulatory Care electives at partnering clinics

Additional longitudinal experiences include: Medication Use Evaluations (MUE), Adverse Drug Reaction (ADR) reports, Drug Consults, Teaching Certificate Program, research, and precepting at the Student-Run Free Clinic

**The psychiatry track includes block rotations in inpatient psychiatry at Center for Behavioral Health and a year-long longitudinal outpatient psychiatry day at LifeLong Medical Care.*

Qualifications

The applicant must have a Doctorate of Pharmacy (PharmD) degree from an ACPE accredited pharmacy school (or in process of pursuing accreditation) or a Foreign Pharmacy Graduate Equivalency Certificate (FPGEC) from the National Association of Boards of Pharmacy (NABP). Applicants must also have U.S. citizenship or Green card and be eligible to sit for examination for CA pharmacist licensure.

Application

Deadline for applications is **January 5, 2018**. Applicants should be ready to sit for the board exams on or before July 31, 2019. Apply online through the PhORCAS system. Please submit a letter of intent, pharmacy school transcript, curriculum vitae and 3 letters of recommendation utilizing the PhORCAS standardized letter.
